

Job Purpose: To ensure all projects are accurately costed at the outset, enabling contracts to be negotiated at fair and sufficient prices. To oversee and manage all costs relating to building and civil engineering projects, from the initial calculations to the final figures. The Senior Quantity Surveyor seeks to minimize the costs of a project and enhance value for money, while still achieving the required standards and quality

The Senior QS will require the following:

- Educated to degree or minimum HND level in a relevant field (Quantity Surveying, Construction Management, Civil Engineering
- Min. 5- 7 years' experience of estimating/quantity surveying in construction with at least 2 in a senior role

The Senior QS will ideally have the following:

- Experience of residential development projects up to £20m
- Experience of contractor's estimating for pre-development costs, groundworks, substructure, superstructure
- Experience of social housing

Reporting to the Chief Operating Officer, the role will involve:

- Working with The Wee House Company team to prepare detailed estimates for single house turnkey builds
- Working with Connect Modular business development team to prepare budget estimates and detailed cost plans for affordable housing projects from 5-100 units.
- Assisting in the preparation of tender submissions
- Researching materials and labour costs and reviewing potential value engineering options.
- Planning job timescales and assess the levels of risk on a project.
- Preparing and sub-contractor/supplier packages for sending out to the market.
- Analysing sub-contractor/supplier quotations for the most competitive and compliant.
- Monitoring the stages of projects to ensure that costs are kept in line with forecasts.
- Attend relevant client meetings and site visits
- Submitting monthly valuations to clients
- Presenting costs plans and value engineering opportunities to management
- Development of the estimating/cost planning system and standard cost plan template to
 ensure all current financial information is incorporated and becomes integrated with the
 contract financial reporting system, enabling a complete audit trail from initial estimate to
 out-turn cost.
- Keeping up to date with changes in labour and materials pricing





- Reporting on budget vs. actual costs
- Use information on whole carbon lifecycle assessment and net zero operational carbon to present upfront costs vs. long term savings to potential customers.

Key Responsibilities:

Cost Management and Estimation:

- Prepare detailed cost estimates and budgets for projects.
- Conduct cost analysis and prepare reports on variations.
- Monitor costs and expenditures to ensure they remain within budget.

Contract Administration:

- Draft, review, and manage contracts and subcontracts.
- Ensure that contractual obligations are met and documented.
- Manage contract disputes and claims resolution.

Procurement:

- Oversee the procurement process, including tendering and negotiation with suppliers and subcontractors.
- Evaluate bids and recommend awarding of contracts.

Risk Management:

- Identify potential risks and develop strategies to mitigate them.
- Ensure compliance with legal and regulatory requirements.

Project Coordination:

- Collaborate with project managers, engineers, architects, and other stakeholders.
- Provide financial advice and support to the project team.

Reporting and Documentation:

- Prepare regular financial reports, including cost forecasts and financial statements.
- Maintain accurate records of all financial transactions and project documentation.

Quality Assurance:

- Ensure that project quality standards are met.
- Implement and monitor quality control procedures for the quantity surveying function.

Mentorship and Leadership:

- Lead and mentor junior quantity surveyors and other team members.
- Provide training and development opportunities to team members.
